## Things to keep in mind...

- 3 10-point essays (One will be required, you will have several to choose from for the other two)
- 1 20-point essay (You will have a few to choose from)
- Will cover all three units: Ecology, Sound and Light, and Earth's Water

- Questions will be clustered together (a few from each unit)
- Types of questions will be clustered together (there will be more than one T/F section, more than one Multiple Choice section, etc.)
- All answers will go on an answer sheet
